Second Sunday in Advent Peace

All: We light this candle to shine for peace.



In Pakistan, Hafiza Bibi, a single mother of four, suffered the loss of her husband and daughter and saw her home crumble before her eyes during a devasting monsoon season.

Hafiza's husband had worked as a farmer labourer, while Hafiza stayed at home, caring for her four children. "Our relatives would sometimes help us by giving wheat or money as charity. However, after the floods, everyone suffered badly, and no one we know was able to help," she explains.

Hafiza and her family were selected to participate in a food assistance project supported by PWS&D through our local partner Community World Service Asia, with support from Canadian Foodgrains Bank. "I bought essential food items such as wheat flour, rice, sugar, tea, milk and vegetables. This assistance has provided me with some relief and allowed me to put food on the table for my children," she shares, with peace of mind.

This Advent season, faithfully respond to Christ's call to provide comfort by ensuring families have the necessary resources to sustain their lives.
